FMU's Kelly Center to host small business training in government procurement

FLORENCE, S.C. – The first session of a program designed to help small and minority-owned businesses access government procurement processes will be held on Jan. 21 at the North Dargan Innovation Center.

Francis Marion University's Kelley Center for Enterprise and Innovation, the city and county of Florence and Florence-Darlington Technical College are hosts for the new program, which is aimed at helping the owners of small businesses understand the public bidding process.
