Family Nurse Practitioner

The MSN Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) track option is a 55 credit hour program with over 500 clinical practicum hours. The program prepares Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) to work as primary care practitioners. Emphasis is placed on primary care throughout the lifespan. The MSN/FNP program option is delivered in hybrid format. Classes are conducted either online or face-to-face on Wednesdays. The MSN/FNP plan of study can be completed in two calendar years if started in the Spring (January) term. The MSN/FNP curriculum takes slightly longer than two calendar years if started in the Fall (August) or Summer I (May-June).
