The Playwright Jon Tuttle, Ph.D.

Jon Tuttle is an assistant professor of English at Francis Marion. His specialty is modern dramatic literature, but he moonlights as a playwright. Last year, his full-length play TERMINAL CAFE won a "New Voices" award from the Workshop Theatre in Columbia, where it then ran for a month. It has since played in Los Angeles and Albuquerque.

His one-act play, I WANNA BE A COWBOY, was a finalist for the Heidemann Award at the Actors Theatre of Louisville in 1990. It has been performed in New York, Los Angeles, Atlanta, and soon in Orlando. It is also soon to be published in an anthology of plays called <u>One Act Plays for Acting Students</u>. Its companion play, SYNERGY AND ANARCHY IN THE SOUTH, is scheduled for a production in Atlanta.

A FISH STORY has also won a New Voices Award from the Workshop. Earlier versions of it have been produced by the University of New Mexico and by New Mexico State University, and adapted for radio.
