**Director's statement**: My visual concept for this evening's performances was a worn, sepia-toned photograph to illustrate that even though all three plays were written in the early 20th century, the problems reflected in these plays still plague us. The order of the plays is important, as well. The subjects move from the one most visible in our society (alcoholism) to the one most closeted (domestic violence).

**Dramaturg Statement: The Provincetown Players** was a group of young playwrights whose goal was to create plays that resisted commercial melodramas of the day. The group was created in 1915 in Provincetown, Massachusetts and eventually moved to New York where they opened the Provincetown Playhouse, which still exists today. Many of the plays written by the players were highly controversial and experimental for the time period, dealing with taboo subject matters. Because of their experimental work, many of the playwrights have become a part of the American theatrical canon. The forming of this group was the genesis of the little theatre movement in the United States.


