#### Executive Summary of Report (one-page maximum)

This report includes the mission of the Department of Nursing, which is in alignment with the School of Health Sciences and Francis Marion University. The baccalaureate nursing program has nine end-of-program student learning outcomes (EOPSLOs). These EOPSLOs are derived from the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN) *The Essentials of Baccalaureate Education for Professional Nursing Practice*.

Direct assessment methods were identified for each of the nine student learning outcomes. Several of the assessment methods were changed from the previous academic year to better align with the systematic plan of evaluation (SPE) for the baccalaureate (pre-licensure) nursing program. For written assignments, a consistently high expected level of achievement was used: 95% of students will achieve a grade of 80 or higher on the assignment. A variety of assignments were utilized to evaluate student achievement including papers, presentations, projects, and clinical evaluations. All tools are appropriate to the traditional classroom and/or clinical setting.

All assessment methods were evaluated during the 2018-2019 school year. All baselines and benchmarks were achieved for all criteria. The target was achieved for each end-of-program student learning outcome. The new assessment methods will be re-evaluated next academic year to determine if they are the best measures for the end-of-program student learning outcomes. Changes will be made as needed.
