Catalog Description

This is an educational strategy integrating classroom studies with work-based learning related to the student's academic curriculum and /or career goals. At the work site, students engage in a series of assignments documented in a learning agreement that is subsequently evaluated.

Course Goals

- 1. Implement theory and practice in a real-world setting.
- 2. Function effectively in a professional environment.
- Understand and apply basic and advanced business concepts.

Attendance

Students are required to follow the University's attendance policy.

If you are going to be late or absent from your internship, you must email your supervisor and Prof. Dittman.

Program Requirements

1. Students must work a minimum of 5 hours per week, beginning the week of January 25, and ending on April 26. Students are excused during University holidays. Missed hours must be made up - the student may choose to use holidays to complete missed hours.

2. Students may be asked to attend update meetings with Prof. Dittman as needed. These may be in-person, via phone, or via video conference.

3. Students will complete an Internship MAP which details what the student will accomplish during the Internship.

4. Students will submit weekly updates. A survey from the Dean of the School of Business will be required as part of one of the weekly updates.

- 5. Students will complete a Final Internship Report.
- 6. Students will complete an Internship Independent Project.

7. Students will complete an evaluation on the internship location and on their supervisor.

8. Students will read, sign, and conduct themselves in accordance with the Internship Code of Conduct.

9. Students will conduct themselves according to the policies and procedures of the organization for which they are working.

10. Students will adhere to the Francis Marion University Policy Regarding Sexual Misconduct.
