Application for English 101L Studio Undergraduate Teaching Assistant Positions

Undergraduate Teaching Assistants (UTAs) in the English 101L Writing Studio typically work 2 - 4 hours per week. Primary responsibilities are to attend studio sessions, assist students in the Writing Studio with their work throughout the writing process, collaborate with instructors, and participate in the scheduled training events with other UTAs. Additionally, instructors may include UTAs in other instructional activities, such as sharing a lesson. Under no circumstance would a UTA ever assist with grading or be exposed to grades.

All eligible candidates must have completed English 102 by the start of the semester in which they would begin working in the Writing Studio. A cumulative GPA of 3.0 is recommended for applicants. **UTAs must be full-time students in order to work for pay in the English 101L Studio.**

For work in the fall semester, submit this application by **April 12**th; for work in the spring, submit it by **November 12**th.
