Background Information:

In 2021, the Department of Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) purchased a flexible endoscopy equipment system (FEES), from PatCom Medical (please see Attachment 1), to conduct fiberoptic endoscopic evaluation of swallowing.

The equipment consists of:

The FEES system, offered by PatCom Medical USA Inc., includes all features described below that are very important for FEES and videostroboscopy:
