Questions Asked

Question 1	Our AI/AS 1610 samplers are either 8 sample positions (AI) or 155 sample
	positions (AS). The solicitation specified a turret that holds a minimum of 15
	samples. Are 8 sample positions sufficient? Our systems offer 4 solvent positions
	as well as waste container that are separate on either of our models.
Answer	Due to our class sizes (our maximum laboratory class size is 24 students), we have
	determined that a minimum of 15 samples is required. A sampler with 155 positions
	would be excessive and not ideal for this instrument and potential projects/tests.
Question 2	Under installation, they stated "Vendor should include an uninterrupted power
	supply with the instrument to protect from power surges." First, there are many
	models from Powervar/Ametek that are available, depending on the power load and
	length of time to maintain the GC during the power outage. You should ask these
	questions and also remind them that these devices that have battery backup are
	relatively expensive. Second, if the need is to protect from power surges only, there
	are relatively low cost line filters that protect from surges that are not a UPS.
Answer	The University is requiring a UPS to protect the instrument. The University's
	Chemistry Department has had the unfortunate situation where surge protectors
	have not been enough; it has been deemed that a surge protector or power
	conditioner will NOT be sufficient, and a UPS is required.
Question 3	Are gas cylinder regulators to be included to the response? There are three required
	for a GC/FID: Hydrogen, Air, and an inert regulator for carrier gas (He/N2/Ar).
Answer	Yes, please provide all three regulators.
