

## Francis Marion University Dual Enrollment – The CONTINUUM

*Francis Marion University offers Dual Enrollment courses both in-person at the Continuum and online to eligible students from partnering high schools. Students wishing to participate in dual enrollment courses through FMU should be juniors or seniors, have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, and receive school permission to participate in the courses. Students may take up to four (4) courses per semester, or no more than 14 credit hours.*

**Continuing Dual Enrollment Students:** If you have taken dual enrollment courses with FMU in a current or previous semester, you DO NOT need to re-apply unless specifically told to do so by your counselor or the Director of Dual Enrollment. Updated transcripts and any other missing application documents must be submitted to [dualenrollment@fmarion.edu](mailto:dualenrollment@fmarion.edu) each semester you wish to enroll.

### **NEW Student Application Process:**

Students wishing to take their first Dual Enrollment course(s) for Fall 2026 should follow the directions below to apply.

- 1) Create an account and complete the application for admission at <https://fmarion.campus.eab.com/portal/login>.
  - a. Students must use their **personal email address** for this account, NOT their high school email address or a parent. A validation email will be sent to activate the account.
  - b. The login link that is sent may automatically go to your SPAM folder. The link is only active for 30 minutes but may be copied and pasted directly into your browser after it has expired.
  - c. Submit high school transcript with current class schedule to [dualenrollment@fmarion.edu](mailto:dualenrollment@fmarion.edu)
- 2) Provide proof of citizenship document (non-expired SC Driver's License, Birth Certificate, or Passport. NO Beginner's Permits) to [dualenrollment@fmarion.edu](mailto:dualenrollment@fmarion.edu)

### **Registration Process (NEW and Continuing Students):**

- 1) To register for courses, new and continuing Dual Enrollment students should meet with their school counselor or dual enrollment contact at their high school to discuss courses. Once courses have been determined, the school will notify FMU to register the student for the approved course(s).
- 2) All students must complete the Permission Form EACH semester they enroll at FMU. The Permission Form is required to ensure that students and their parents understand that dual enrollment students must adhere to all policies outlined in the University Catalog. <https://www.fmarion.edu/dualenrollment/dual-enrollment-permission-form/>

Fall registration begins on April 1st. Courses are filled on a first-come, first-served basis for accepted students that meet the eligibility criteria for the course they requested. Students are encouraged to apply early and meet with their school counselor to ensure they are eligible for the courses they wish to take.

## Fall 2026 Course Schedule

Courses offered in-person at the Continuum meet twice/week on Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday from 8:30-9:45 (1<sup>st</sup> Block), 10:00-11:15am (2<sup>nd</sup> Block), and 11:30am-12:45pm (3<sup>rd</sup> Block). Labs for Biology courses meet once a week from 8:30-11:15am on their designated day. Some courses are available only online, as noted above. Online only courses are asynchronous, but not self-paced.
